Content Area: Secondary English Grade Level: 6

Course Name: English 6

English 6 is aligned with the Next Generation English Language Arts standards and instructional learning activities are designed to emphasize skills and strategies in the areas of reading, writing, listening, speaking and language. Students apply close reading techniques to analyze both fiction and nonfiction works and are exposed to a wide variety of literary works. The elements of grammar, usage, punctuation, and capitalization are taught, through the student's own written work and through literature. Effective writing techniques are emphasized and most writing is done in response to texts read. Students will be prepared to successfully complete the NYS grade 6 English Language Arts assessment.
