## **Taste Testing at North Colonie Elementary Schools**

"Liked It, Loved It, Tried It (Not My Favorite)." Those were the feedback options for Loudonville Elementary School students who chose to taste test the cherry tomato and corn salad recently during lunch. The taste test is part of North Colonie's "Harvest of the Month," which is one of the district Farm to School initiatives.

"Harvest of the Month is a fun way to promote New York grown fruits and vegetables, as well as NY dairy products," Farm to School Facilitator Amber Cost said. "The idea is to think of different ways to incorporate the Harvest of the Month item onto the menus and have kids, hopefully, try new things. Introducing taste tests of a recipe lets students try fresh, local ingredients in a fun and exciting way, with the opportunity to provide feedback and tell us what they think."

The program brings plenty of local ingredients to the district. The basil in the salad was harvested right from the SHS garden and the cherry tomatoes were from Hillard's Greenhouse in Latham. While the tasting at Loudonville was just the sampling, the tomato and corn salad were placed on the lunch menu elementary-wide the very next week for "New York Thursday." Each school will have a chance for taste tests in the coming weeks and months.

"This is a great opportunity to have real conversations with students about the food they are eating in the cafeteria," Cost said. "It helps us raise awareness about our Farm to School programs and our pledge to increase the amount of fresh and local ingredients we are serving throughout the district."
